Formed in early 2007, and based in Milwaukee, WI., Perry Weber & The DeVilles are one the most exciting Blues/Roots groups to come on the scene in a while! Featuring Perry Weber on quitar & vocals, Dave Kasik on bass & vocals, Ben Rickun on harmonica and Vic Span on drums. we were both raised up in the same town on the Mississippi River in Western Illinois, Rock Island ... those decades in age between us didn't separate us as good friends ... and I was honored to have presented the River Road Lifetime Achievement Award to Francis at the Mississippi Vallev Blues Festival a few years ago ... in our home area ... and the icing on the cake was being asked by Francis a few weeks before the presentation ... if I would please put together a seven-piece blues band featuring Midwest/regional 'all-stars' to perform with him at the festival. It was a grand day. The crowd was huge, and included many of Francis's hometown relatives ... he was most gracious as we acknowledged his contributions to the blues and the Universe with the award presentation. The mayor of Davenport, IA presented him with the key to the city. Francis smiled broadly as we played our short set ... that included the jazz instrumental, "Caravan," ... yes, with Francis taking a superb extended drum solo. Francis was very happy. That is how I will remember him. R.I.P. Francis Clay.

Blind Pig vinyl Virgin vinyl LPs released!

Blind Pig Records, one of the world's leading independent American roots music labels, has annouced that it will begin issuing high-guality 180 gram virgin vinvl LPs. The first three titles to be released as part of the "Master Vinyl Series" will be The Lost Tapes by Muddy Waters, Drinkin' TNT 'n' Smokin' Dynamite by Buddy Guy and Junior Wells, and Painkiller by Tommy Castro. These limited-edition pressings

will be released on May 6, 2008, the same date as Blind Pig's CD release by Kenny Neal, entitled Let Life Flow.

Blind Pig plans to issue a select number of titles this year under the Master Vinyl Series, most likely three at a time.

"This is in response to the growing audiophile market for high-quality LPs," said label president Edward Chmelewski. "And for those of us who fondly remem ber listening to LPs in the 60s and 70s, it's a lot of fun to return to that format. For one, it's great to have the larger artwork canvas afforded by the LP packaging, and the warmth and depth of the sound quality on these new versions is amazing. And it's kind of cool to come full circle back to the LP, the only format we were selling when

we started the label in

1977." Added label owner Jerry Del Giudice, "It's interesting that there are a growing number of young listeners that are enjoying not only the enhanced sound quality of the LP but the social nature of



The Muddy Waters release consists of live recordings from 1971 and features the blues icon in strong performances with his legendary band members - Pinetop Perkins, George "Harmonica" Smith, Sammy Lawhorn, Pee Wee Madison, Calvin "Fuzz" Jones and Willie "Big Eves" Smith.

The Buddy Guy and Junior Wells album was recorded live in 1974 at the Montreux Jazz Festival, with the dynamic duo backed on bass by Rolling Stone Bill Wyman. Wyman licensed the recording to Blind Pig, and over the years it has steadily remained the all-time best-selling title in the label's catalog.

Tommy Castro's Painkiller is the latest studio masterpiece from the virtuoso performer of blue collar Rock 'n' Soul music. It was just voted "Album of the Year 2007" by the readers of Blueswax, the largest subscribed blues publication in the world. The recording was produced by the renowned John Porter, who's noted for his work with Los Lonely Boys, Santana, and Buddy Guy, among others. The LP will mark the first vinvl release of Castro's distinguished seventeen year career.

Francis Clay 1923-2008

Francis Clay Born 11/16/23, Rock Island, IL - Died. 1/22/08, San Francisco, CA Blues legend Francis Clay, former longtime Muddy Waters drummer, played with a who's who of Jazz and R&B icons, including Charlie Parker, Jay McShann, Billy Holiday, Little Walter, Lightnin Hopkins, John Lee Hooker, Sonny Boy Williamson, Otis Spann, Big Mama Thornton, and James Cotton (who started the original James Cotton Blues Band with Clay in 1966). Charlie Watts of the Rolling Stones raved about watching Francis play back in the 1960s with Muddy, saying, "Clay was one of the most exciting drummers he'd ever seen and heard.



Francis Clay was a kind, intelligent, gentle man, super musician, extraordinary poet/writer ... and a longtime friend ... to many. I was honored to have been in the wide circle of people who knew and loved Francis Clay. Although from different eras, Francis and I are 'homeboys' ...

Peter Karp was a military kid who spent his early years moving around from New Jersey to Southern Alabama and picking up musical styles wherever he went. Fine guitar playing and singing work with the 12 original songs to make for good listening. This CD has a real Texas/country side filtered through the blues that made me think of Austin. Intelligent songs keep your attention and the stories match up with the grooves. This guy has a better vocabulary than I do. My wife even likes it. It should be easy to find since it's on Alligator Records. Highly recommended.

A highlight toward the end of the concert was when mother and daughter shared the stage for an extended, crowd-pleasing rendition of the old standard, "Fever."




